# SHORT-TERM MISSIONS, LONG-TERM EFFECTS

2025 has been a strong year for short-term missions from Immanuel. Beginning in February, 171 from our church family have gone out on mission in ten teams to eight different countries. We are so grateful to these ambassadors who boldly carried the gospel and the love of God to distant and needy places. Thank you as well to all who supported them financially and through their prayers. God has used our united hearts and hands to accomplish much good for His glory!

While it is costly to send teams to distant places in South America, Europe and Africa, Immanuel has maintained a steady commitment to short-term missions since the first team flew out to Colombia in 1973. Short-term mission and outreach projects (STOMP) strengthen the churches and outreach of IBC-supported missionaries and partner ministries. They help our people see up-close what God is doing all over the world. In addition, participants often return with a strong desire to continue praying for and finding ways to bless people in the places they visit.



As usual, STOMP teams from Student Ministries led the way with 77 participants on four projects. Middle Schoolers traveled to Knott County, Kentucky. While there, they ran an evangelistic VBC program at Victory Baptist Church and completed work projects at homes of two financially-challenged families. Adults who accompanied them reported that the students grew significantly in their passion for sharing the gospel, even during their free time. A high school team ministered in Dayton, OH, especially with children from Congo and Sudan. One highlight was working with four children from Muslim families who spent the week singing praise songs and learning about Jesus.

Internationally, Student Ministries sent teams to Dominican Republic and Costa Rica. The Costa Rican team prepared VBS lessons all in Spanish and were able to clearly present the gospel to dozens of children in a local school. The DR team returned for a third year and ministered to churches in Santo Domingo in a variety of ways. One participant saw two local youth respond to his gospel presentation and was able to connect them to a local youth pastor.

Music and Worship fielded the largest STOMP team in 2025, with 49 taking the gospel and music skills to Dominican Republic. They worked with believers and people from the local community and had many opportunities to share their faith. Strong links with local musicians were forged, and now 15 musicians from the DR are traveling to NOVA next month to join the IBC orchestra for a concert on October 18!

The College team traveled to a closed Caribbean country and experienced concentrated times of evangelism. They shared the gospel in homes with over 100 people and saw 21 place their faith in Jesus Christ! They also led a four-day VBS with over 150 children.

A Spanish-speaking team of 17 from Hispanos en Christo ministered for the tenth year in the Amazon region of Ecuador. Part of the team went deep into the jungle to do construction work at a Bible college. Others stayed in the city of Shell and led outreach programs for women and children.









A team of ten connected for a third straight year with IBC missionaries Jordan and Jenny Standridge in Rome, Italy. The English camp they led had a strong, positive impact on the community where Standridges have planted a church. Ten others from IBC joined a larger team that ministered in southern France. As a result of their first week in Carcassonne, three new families are now attending the church. The second week was spent in Marseille, where an IBC missionary serves. The VBS program they led enabled four Muslim children and a number of unchurched families to hear the gospel multiple times.

A four-man team both traveled the farthest (to Tanzania) and the highest (19,341 feet) to the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro. They joined with several others and raised a significant amount







of money for the children's feeding program of our partner ministry in Rwanda. Soon after their return, we heard of a drought in East Africa that was causing many families to depend on the feeding program.
