

Dennis Call currently serves as the Director, Benefits Legislative Affairs Service in the Office of Congressional and Legislative Affairs for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in Washington, D.C. A Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) in the U.S. Army Reserve, Dennis commissioned as an Infantry second lieutenant from Officer Candidate School, Fort Benning, Georgia in April 2004. He served in a wide variety of leadership assignments over his fourteen years on active duty, most notably as a rifle platoon leader and battalion mortar platoon leader with 3rd Battalion, 187th Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), Fort Campbell, Kentucky from January 2005 to March 2009; Assistant Operations Officer and rifle company commander with 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 10th Mountain Division (Light), Fort Drum, New York from November 2009 to June 2010. He deployed to Samarra, Iraq from September 2005 to September 2006 and Mahmudiyah, Iraq from January 2008 to November 2008 with the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. From March to December 2011, LTC Call deployed to Nalgham, Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.



As an Army Congressional Fellow, Dennis earned a Master of Professional Studies in Legislative Affairs from the Graduate School of Political Management at George Washington University. In 2013, he served in the office of Republican Senator Richard Burr of North Carolina. Following his fellowship year, he completed a two-year assignment as a Congressional Liaison with the Army Staff at the Pentagon in Arlington, VA. His last assignment on active duty was as the Battalion Executive Officer for 2nd Battalion, 23rd Infantry Regiment, 4th Infantry Division at Fort Carson, Colorado. LTC Call is a Congressional Liaison with the Legislative Affairs Division in the Office, Chief of Army Reserve. A graduate of the Helms School of Government at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Virginia, Dennis received a Master of Arts in Public Policy: Public Administration. Prior to joining the Army Dennis served as the Director of College Ministries at First Baptist Church in Texico, N.M. where he mentored students at Eastern New Mexico University in Portales, N.M.
