JESUS WAS DEDICATED

Matthew 2; Luke 2

**WHAT DID JESUS DO TO SAVE US?
JESUS LIVED A SINLESS LIFE, DIED ON THE CROSS, AND ROSE FROM THE DEAD.**

Mary and Joseph's baby—God's own Son—was a few days old when Mary and Joseph named Him Jesus. When Jesus was a few weeks old, Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem.

Mary and Joseph wanted to obey God and His law. At the temple, Mary and Joseph presented Jesus to the Lord and offered two birds as a sacrifice.

Another man was at the temple. His name was Simeon. Simeon loved God, and He trusted in God's promise to send a Messiah to save people from sin. God's Spirit was with Simeon. That day, God's Spirit had led Simeon to the temple. God's Spirit showed Simeon that Jesus was the promised Messiah. Simeon was so happy. He praised God and said, "Lord, You kept Your promise, and I have seen the One who will save people from sin."

A woman named Anna was at the temple too. She stayed at the temple and worshiped and served God all the time. Anna talked about Jesus to people who were waiting for God to keep His promise to send a Savior. She told them the good news: the Savior was here!

Jesus grew up and was strong and healthy. He was wise, and God was happy with Him.

Christ Connection: Throughout the Old Testament, God promised the arrival of a King who would redeem people. When Jesus arrived, Simeon and Anna knew He was the promised Messiah, God's own Son. We can trust Jesus for our salvation, and like Simeon and Anna, we should share the good news.
