## LEADERS WANTED TO TRICK JESUS

Matthew 22

### HOW IS JESUS THE PERFECT PROPHET? JESUS PERFECTLY REVEALS GOD THE FATHER AND FULFILLS WHAT THE PROPHETS SPOKE.

The religious leaders decided to ask Jesus tricky questions. The men said, "Is it right to pay taxes to Caesar or not?"

"Why are you trying to trick Me?" He asked. "Show Me the coin you use to pay taxes."

The men brought Him a denarius. Jesus asked, "Whose picture is on the coin?"

"Caesar's," they answered.

Jesus said, "Then give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and give to God what belongs to God."

Later, the religious leaders came to Jesus again. "Teacher, which command is the greatest?" they asked.

Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. The second most important command is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself."

Then Jesus asked the religious leaders: "Whose son is the Messiah?"

"David's," they said.
