## DAVID SINNED AND WAS RESTORED

2 Samuel 11-12; Psalm 51

**IS ANYTHING OR ANYONE GREATER THAN GOD?  
NO, GOD IS GREATER THAN EVERYTHING AND EVERYONE.**

One evening, David was walking on the roof of his palace and saw a beautiful woman. Even though she was someone else's wife, David sent messengers to get her and bring her to him.

David found out that Bathsheba was pregnant with his baby. But she was already married. So, David made a plan to kill her husband Uriah. David wrote a letter to Joab and told him to put Uriah at the front line so Uriah could be easily killed. Joab obeyed King David, and Uriah died. David took Bathsheba to be his wife.

The Lord sent Nathan to David. Nathan told David a story: "There was a rich man and a poor man. The rich man had lots of sheep, but the poor man had just one lamb he loved very much. When the rich man needed a lamb to prepare a meal, he took the lamb from the poor man." David was extremely angry with the rich man in the story! Nathan replied, "You are the rich man!
