They also took a day to visit the children in the daycare, gave a devotional to the women in the development program, and put on a VBS for the children together with the men's team. While the women were dedicating their time to the women and children, the men's team built benches for churches, put on a half day men's conference, and then teamed up with the women for VBS. November 12th Outing - Sight & Sound Theater by Steve Holley


