<u>Sheets & Towels</u> The shelter overnight guest population is growing once again. There is an immediate need for white twin sheet sets, standard pillowcases and bath towels. You can drop your donations in the CUM Bin in the Atrium.

<u>Bless Kids This Summer @ Camp Bennett</u> The Mission hosts inner-city at-risk youth every summer at our camp in Brookeville, Maryland. You can bless them with hygiene or snack bags or both! Hygiene gift bag – body wash, shampoo/conditioner, toothbrush/paste, wet wipes, lotion, lip blam, sunscreen and bug spray. Put a scripture or word of encouragement inside!

Snack gift bag – fruit cup, fruit roll-up, pop-tart, granola bar, crackers, pretzels, hard candy (no chocolate), drink box, and a water bottle. Put a scripture or word of encouragement inside!

<u>Family Ministry Center – Non-perishable Food & Gift Card Donations</u> FMC is serving twice as many families since the start of the pandemic. Please drop non-perishable food items in the Mission bin in the Atrium any Sunday. Gift cards for Amazon and Giant are given to elderly and single parent households with children attending school virtually. It allows them to order their food online to be delivered.
